11.30 am Smuggler Jack

A five-piece band playing self-penned numbers and foot-tapping covers in a repertoire that spans blues, jazz, rock, and a hint of soul.

His band The Face were part of the mod revival in 1979/80 and debuted supporting Paul Jones (Manfred Mann) and The Blues Band at the Bridge House in Canning Town. They performed at prestigious venues: The Music Machine (now Koko), Moonlight Club, and Hastings Pier Ballroom. The Face reformed in 2014 and have supported From the Jam (Bruce Foxton), The Vapors (Turning Japanese), The Members (Sound of the Suburbs) and Secret Affair (Time for Action). Les will be performing songs from the '60s to the present.

2.15 pm Pennyless
